County History: Coconino County was originally part of Yavapai County before its establishment in 1891. At its inception, the county had a population of 4,000 residents. The varied natural and agricultural resources in the area, such as lumber, cattle, wool, and building stone, allowed the county to quickly grow. Coconino County is the second largest county in the continental United States and has more land area than some European countries and a handful of states. The County is home to the highest point in Arizona, Humphreys Peak, Northern Arizona University, and part of Grand Canyon National Park.
