County History: Gila County was originally part of both Maricopa and Pinal County before its establishment in 1881. After 1881, a part of Yavapai County was added to the county's borders. At the end of the 19th century, Gila County experience "silver fever" which spurred both population and economic growth. After the silver mines were depleted, copper became the main mining source and continues to be so today. With the construction of the Roosevelt Dam in 1911, Roosevelt Lake was created, helping to make recreation and tourism leading industries for the county.
