County History: Pinal County was originally part of both Maricopa and Pima Counties before its establishment in 1875. The meaning of “Pinal” is not definite, leading some to theorize that the name could represent the Pinal Apaches (called *Pinalenos* by the Spanish), pine groves, or deer (*pinal* in Apache means “deer”). Due to the County’s position between Maricopa and Pinal Counties, the northern part of the County has seen growth due in part to its proximity to the Phoenix area, while the southern part of the County has seen growth due in part to its proximity to the Tucson area. This has made Pinal County one of the fastest growing counties in Arizona.
